Veteran Access to Care Worksheet

This worksheet is designed to help NH Veterans find appropriate local resources.

- Have you ever served in the military?
 - **Yes?** Contact the VA Medical Center (VAMC) in Manchester to check eligibility status and to enroll for services or enroll online by following the VAMC link below.
 - **No/Not Eligible for Benefits?** Contact ServiceLink to find out about community providers and services available in your area.

- Do you require assistance to live in your home?
 - **Financial?** Contact the NH State Office of Veteran Services to apply for the Aid & Attendance Benefit. Contact ServiceLink to apply for Medicaid or an assistance grant.
 - **Personal Care, Homemaking or Transportation?** Contact ServiceLink to find community providers and services available in your area.

- Are you a family caregiver looking for information or support?
 - Contact VA Caregiver Support.

Please Note: When contacting these agencies for information about Veteran services, you may need to provide the Veteran's proof of service (DD-214, military identification, etc.) and a list of income and resources.
