These last several months were full of celebration, worry, sorrow, and new found and inc Support. First off, thank you to all who supported us through the possible Town of Derry crisis by writing your local town councilor, appearing at a town meeting and expressing y thanks for our irreplaceable services. I truly feel the Town of Derry was strengthened by experience, and we were in the end spared from being cut and were fully funded. We we however, not so fortunate with the Granite United Way for their next cycle which started For the first time in 27 years, we are not receiving allocated dollars from their community ment team in the southern region. This loss is both financial and emotional for us. They h become part of our DNA and identity all these many years through each merger, and we k from their current and short term goals and objectives that we will probably not fit into strategy for a good few years. Please know we will still be receiving designated funds th employee giving campaign participants as we are still a qualified partner.

Miraculously, two funders/fundraisers are helping us through this unex Alexander. The Eastman Foundation awarded us \$25,000, an increase of \$7,500 from last year and our 10 poker tournament we participate in the Granite State Poker Alliance we us \$13,500, more than twice as much as we have ever made in the 9 years we have participated.

I am so appreciative that your service exists. You were helpful, kind, and so fast - in and out. Thank you, from a struggling mom."

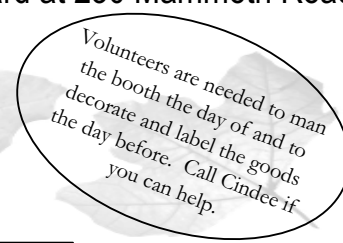

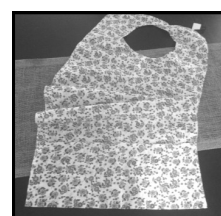
