## **SATURDAY, OCTOBER 1st 2016**

We were so grateful to the Town of Hampstead for wanting to partner with our group long-term on their first annual town-wide yard sale, and to SAVERS in Plaistow for complementing the event with a 4-day collection drive fundraiser. There was no manual for how to organize this event, and we had an interesting time developing a town map from scratch. We were pleasantly surprised with the number of people who signed up to host a sale (64 individual sites, 3 group sites and 7 at the community site). Thank you to everyone who still held their yard sale despite the terrible weather, or donated to Savers on their own or dropped off their left-overs at the UHAUL truck at the town hall that day. We had \$1758 in expenses such as signs, printing costs, mailing costs, etc., and we grossed \$4,455 from sponsors, registration forms and Savers dollars. **So, we still walked away with \$2,671.** Not bad for a first attempt.

Special thank you to our sponsors: St. Anne Parish for use of the parking lot for community site and selling maps. Hampstead Health & Fitness and Depot Crossing Gas Station for allowing us to sell maps there. Frito Lay and Pepsi Co for goodies given out for free with the \$2 map donation. Pentucket Bank for underwriting the event. New England Duplicator and Green Turtle Press for map design and street signs. Alpha Locksmith for tee-shirt and ad sponsorship. J & B Butcher for yard sign & map sponsorship. The following businesses additionally sponsored an ad on our map: Hampstead Center Market, Bre's Ice Cream, Ian Handel - Realtor- Century 21, Hampstead Sports and Rehab, Treasurers Hallmark and Staci Loeffler -Realtor- Keller Williams.

We already have a list of ways that we would like to improve the event this year: selling maps the day before as well as the day of, having more map selling locations, having the community site in a location that could be moved inside in the case of rain, and more intersection directional signs. **Please mark your calendars for Saturday, October 7th to either host, sponsor or attend.**




Our community partners were very generous over the holiday season. Thank you all the more for making it memorable for volunteers & clients.




